

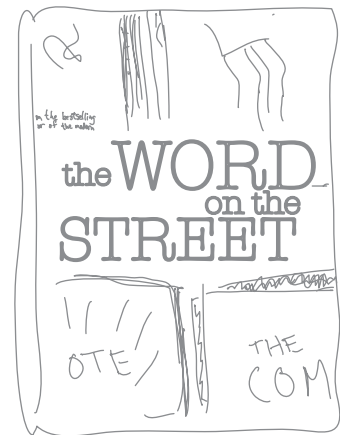
CAN WE TRY THIS? #6 BOOK VENDOR BOOK
